INTRODUCTION

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Like many artists, I started creating art from a young age. The support of family, the admiration of others, the opportunity to freely express as well as the pocket money that art earned me would encourage me as a teenager to take it more seriously.

Effectively, my professional artistic career spans almost two decades and has seen the creation of about 80 paintings and 25 sculptures. A fourth of these are in private and family collections in Nigeria. I currently retain about half of my artworks, while the remaining pieces are in private and public collections in Luxembourg, France, Belgium, Germany, Netherlands and Spain.

As you will discover in this catalogue, my paintings are distinctly colourful yet also subdued. I am of the school of colourism, simplism, didacticism, figurative, abstract and contemporary art. I paint unconventionally with improvised cups and bottles, often pouring and spreading paint on canvas with different levels of control. This self-developed technique results in my three ecstatically distinct groups of paintings. I paint mostly with acrylic especially since 2017.


Generally, I am inspired by my experiences, by people, events, life [and death], the world around and within me, the *past and* the *future*. I love stories and I enjoy telling many through colours.

Uyi Nosa-Odia, UNO

is a Nigerian Luxembourg-based artist. Born and raised in Benin City, he learned to sculpt before going to study painting and general art at Auchi Polytechnic, Nigeria 2006. He further studied banking and finance at the University of Benin, Nigeria 2014. He earned a certificate in Economics and Informatics from the Ukhta State Technological University, Russia 2016. The artist fled his home country to Europe in 2015 after surviving a double headshot in an assassination attempt in October 2014.

Since arriving in Luxembourg in 2017, he has established himself as a versatile artist with more than 20 solo and group exhibitions to his name in Luxembourg, Germany and the UK. The self-exiled Nigerian artist mostly dedicates his art to socio-cultural related topics and projects.

His works and art projects have been shown in both notable public institutions and in galleries. Some of these include: the Nigeria National Museum, Lagos; the Larochette Castle, Larochette; the Luxembourg Central Train Station, Luxembourg; and the Chambre des Salariés, Luxembourg. UNO is also the founder of Lëtz Art, a Luxembourg non-profit organisation dedicated to creating, implementing and supporting social art projects for public benefit.







Besides the usual participation in thematic and open group or solo exhibitions, UNO favours creating art projects with specific themes involving the creation of bodies of artworks dedicated entirely to the given theme of the projects.

PROJECTS,





THE JUJU PEOPLE

is an ongoing contemporary painting project started by UNO in 2022 consisting of the creation of several paintings from research drawn from books, artefacts, historical records and modern-day *juju* (African religious practices) in Edo State, Nigeria. Each painting is used to tell stories of different deities, gods, ancestral spirits as well as of the Benin/Edo peoples and their environment.

UNO hopes to use the project to increase awareness about topics such as identity, Africanism, religious diversity, while also offering contemporary interpretations to the thousands of Benin Bronzes in museums in Europe.

As of January 2023, one painting, UHU (Head Deity) has been completed while four are being worked on.






TABLEAUX DE FUSION

is a social art project created by UNO and implemented as part of the celebration of the 2022 European Capital of Culture, ESCH-SUR-ALZETTE, ESCH2022, Luxembourg's second most populated city. The project incorporated photography, digital art/design, printing and painting together on the same canvases. 17 artists of different nationalities participated in the project with at least four artists of different artistic professions creating each given artwork. 45 artworks were created and exhibited in the *Kamellebuttek Contemporary Art Gallery*, Eschsur-Alzette with the partnership of some private and public organisations. Each artwork represented historical sites, peoples and cultural events from the 27 countries of the European Union, the 19 communities and towns of the Culture Capital and one for the international community.

Luxembourg is famous for its small but highly diverse population. The project was therefore used to highlight this while promoting artistic cooperation, cultural diversity, integration and the archiving of history through art.

X-RAY

is a social art project created by UNO and implemented in 2021 in partnership with the organisations *Omega 90* ASBL, the Ville de Larochette, *Literandra ASBL* and the Larochette Castle Museum & Monument. It involved the creation and exhibition of ten paintings and ten resin sculptures to raise awareness about mental health in young people.

The exhibition which was held in the 11th century castle was well received by many. A digital magazine titled, *DEEP* was published by *Literandra* in collaboration with the artist to document details of each artwork and the project in general.






L.A.L.A. 2022 Acrylic on canvas 160 x 200 cm (Available. Artist collection)

A painting with a deep secret only to be revealed to whoever owns it.

Q. What is the full name? A. That is also a secret.



UHUN (HEAD DEITY) Acrylic on canvas 160 x 200 cm 2022 (Available. Artist collection)

Most coveted amongst thousands of the Benin Bronzes are the Bronze Head(s). One was sold for £10m in 2016. This painting, first in The Juju People project, offers contemporary interpretations to the centuries old religious practice of the Edo People (formerly Benin Kingdom, in southern Nigeria). Practiced by millions and central to the religion is the belief that the head is the seat of the Ehi (soul/spirit) and a direct link to ancestral spirits. Whereas the practice is essentially the same throughout the region, objects used differ based on an individual's social ranking, family lines and community.

For this painting, earthy colours were used to capture the face. This was inspired by the predominantly reddish orange soil of the region. Whereas the backgrounds bluish green colour is reminiscent of the verdigris patina formed on brass, bronze and copper, materials used in the *Bronze Heads*.



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LE TIGRE

The Tiger is the third painting in the endangered animal painting series. It captures the *last call* of a tiger for *help* before getting killed by poachers. The painting, like the *Rhino* and *Un Éléphant ou d'Ivoire*, were created between 2018 and 2020 as part of my support for the conservation of wildlife and nature.

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LA VIE (LIFE)

Every painting has a life of its own. Some take a more dramatic form than the others. *La Vie* started out as a giant still-life painting. After a salvageable accidental colour spill, I saw something different on the canvas. This is the semblance of what I saw.

I love walks. Never more so than during the 2020 COVID-19 lockdowns . The forest floor filled with blooms and blossoms. Or maybe the pandemic had forced *me* to notice this more during this unexpected break as spring renewed the land. This painting was my effort to preserve those moments spent walking or watching birds and insects in *nature*.

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THE FAMILY CIRCLE



Third in a series of abstract portrait paintings of women, the series spotlights similarities in struggles that women face worldwide. Five paintings of different sizes, colour schemes and models were created for the *La Femme* series between 2018 and 2020. Three are in private collections in Luxembourg and Germany while two remain in the artist's private collection. In this version, the model is placed on the side of the canvas. This implies the often second place women occupy in societies.





AMÈ (WATER)

First, he builds himself. Then his family. *He* is the society. The painting represents UNO's convictions that the strengthening of the family unit, starting from oneself, invariably builds society.

UN ÉLÉPHANT OU D'VOIRE? (AN ELEPHANT OR IVORY?)

This is the first in a series of three endangered animal paintings of an elephant, a rhino and a tiger. 


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CONTENTMENT

Family sucks Family hurts Family talks No matter what Family is all


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DEMAIN (TOMORROW)
